What is the purpose of this program?

Deciding to participate in a clinical trial is an important decision for patients and their families. When entering a clinical trial, the expense required to arrange travel to and from a study site may be considered a barrier to participation. This Program eliminates that barrier.

NORD's Clinical Trial Travel Assistance Program provides individuals participating in the AT01-301 Phase 3 Imaging Agent Study with financial and travel support assistance for travel to the Study site.



Who is eligible for this program?

If you have been invited to enrolled in the AT01-301 Phase 3 Imaging Agent Study, you may be referred to NORD by the study investigators.

- A NORD Patient Services Representative will contact you to begin the process for arranging your travel for your study site visit.
- NORD will book and prepay your travel costs and will review with you the process for reimbursement of some additional out-of-pocket costs you may encounter during your study participation. Reimbursement for eligible expenses will be in accordance with the Program's financial guidelines that are set in advance by NORD.

About the program

The National Organization for Rare Disorders (NORD), has been contracted to administer a Clinical Trial Travel Program that will provide financial support and concierge travel arrangements for individuals participating in the amyloidosis AT01-301 Phase 3 Imaging Agent Study.

- For study participants traveling greater than 100 miles to Study site, the program will arrange and prepay the cost of airfare and up to one night lodging for the study participant and one (1) caregiver/support person accompanying the participant.
- Participants who will be traveling less than 100 miles to the Study site using their personal vehicle will be reimbursed for mileage, parking, and tolls (if applicable). Receipts for parking and tolls are required.
- Meals for the study participant and one (1) caregiver/support person accompanying the participant will receive a daily meal stipend of \$50/participant and \$50 accompanying support person/caregiver. This stipend will be provided via a prepaid debit card (PEX card).
- A \$75 Participation stipend will be paid to Study participant for each completed Study site visit. This Participation stipend will be paid post Study site visit within 7-10 days of Study site coordinator notification to NORD of visit completion.
